Special Park Districts Forum

Every year, park and recreation industry leaders, community leaders and professionals gather to participate in the Special Park Districts Forum (SPDF). This unique forum allows participants to exchange best practices, explore emerging trends and engage with industry professionals from across North America.

The 2025 SPDF will be in Southeast Michigan and will be co-hosted by four prominent park and recreation agencies: Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR), Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority (HCMA), Oakland County Parks (OCP) and Wayne County Parks (WCP).

The forum is conducted almost entirely in the field, touring facilities, and gathering hands-on experience. The interactive nature of this forum lends itself to greater opportunities for relationship building beyond what could be expected from a typical conference.

Michigan Department of Natural Resources

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) manages 104 state parks and 140 forest campgrounds, spanning 360,000 acres for outdoor recreation. The recent addition of Flint State Park underscores our commitment to expanding access to natural spaces. Michigan's parks, attracting over 35 million annual visitors, rank among the nation's top for overnight stays, supported by the affordable Recreation Passport program. Since 2011, the program has awarded over \$18 million in grants to local communities. Belle Isle in Detroit showcases Michigan's dedication to preserving urban natural spaces and is the second most visited state park



nationally. The DNR's expansion of unique services and park spaces in metro Detroit further enhance access to state park programs and properties for residents.

Huron-Clinton Metroparks

One of the United States' premier regional park systems, the Huron-Clinton Metroparks have served the people of Southeast Michigan since 1940. The Metroparks are made up of 13 properties in Livingston, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, and Wayne counties - primarily located along the Huron and Clinton rivers. Available activities include fishing, swimming, boating, hiking, nature study, biking, golf, winter sports and so much more. The Metroparks also provide educational resources on science, nature, history and the environment through an award-winning Interpretive Department. Come see for yourself how the Metroparks bring the benefits of parks and recreation to the people of southeast Michigan.

Oakland County Parks

Oakland County Parks (OCP) has played an important role in the lives of Oakland County residents for more than 50 years. OCP is driven by a vision where everyone has access to a park, public space, or recreational opportunity to relax, be active, socialize, and connect with nature. The park system started with 200 acres in 1966. Today, it boasts more than 7,000 acres and 80 miles of trails across 15 locations and has experienced rapid growth in recent years. Nearly two-million visitors from across 62 communities attend OCP parks and programs each year. OCP provides a huge variety of recreation, leisure and learning opportunities throughout their parks and is home to two nature centers, three dog parks, five golf courses, two waterparks, two



campgrounds, an off-road vehicle park and the Oakland County Farmers Market.

Wayne County Parks

Wayne County Parks (WCP) is a division of the Wayne County Department of Public Services established in 1919 with the purpose of enhancing the quality of life for families and residents of the 43 communities of Wayne County. WCP maintains 5,600 acres of parkland and operate 40 locations, which include 37 parks, a golf course, a marina, Crosswinds Marsh, Nankin Mills Interpretive Center and the Wayne County Family Aquatic Center.

Wayne County Parks holds hundreds of educational and recreational events all year long including field trips, nature walks, and hosts classic annual events such as the Marshmallow Drops at Nankin Mills Park and Elizabeth Park, Jazz on the

River and the Wayne County Lightfest. Wayne County is committed to offering the best park experiences for families to enjoy.


What is a Special Park District?

Special park districts are organizations dedicated to providing parks, recreation opportunities, natural resource management and open space preservation. They differ from typical park and recreation agencies because they operate as independent governmental units with their own governing boards, are generally much larger in both acreage and workforce and typically create more of a regional draw.

Who attends SPDF?






